

## april 24-may 26, 2013

**DOOROOMWINDOW** is a group exhibition in two parts—pt.1 is at steven harvey fine art projects and pt.2 at the PULSE NEW YORK fair. It examines the connection between painting and interior space.- how framing by door, window or room echoes the relationship of the image in painting to its rectangular support.

In the gallery, Bill Rice's (1931-2006) abstract view through the blinds of a bar, and Jane Dickson's (b. 1952) cropped figure in a hallway, both revel in the atmosphere of the city at night. Like Majumdar, Gideon Bok (b. 1966) finds an expanding universe within the realms of his studio, by tracking pathways of objects, visitors and light. Kurt Knobelsdorf's (b. 1979) anonymous figure in a blue doorway derives from the view of a surveillance camera. Eleanor Ray's (b. 1987) doorway is a passageway into her microcosmos and Stephanie Pierce's (b. 1974) dark plant is a mysterious still life from her fractally observed reality.

The artists at PULSE include Guy Yanai (b. 1977). Yanai breaks down images into graphic units like brightly colored children's duplo blocks. In his series called *Doors* from 2000, Robert Birmelin (b. 1933), known for paintings of city walkers, here confounds perception by turning reality simultaneously up and down. Karla Wozniak (b. 1978) deconstructs the American roadway, in a mash-up of painterly wash and highway signs. Sangram Majumdar (b. 1976) pictures his studio as a vessel of infinite possibilities: a screen becomes a mysterious framing devices gleaming amid studio detritus.


Concurrently with *dooroomwindow* in SHFAP's rear gallery we present paintings by Peter Acheson (b. 1954). From a generation of freestyle Williamsburg abstract painters that includes Katherine Bradford and Chris Martin, in Acheson's dense works, collage and language are intermingled in tough poetic painted objects.




